

In the Civil Section will be found the objects which illustrate the daily life and customs of the ancient Egyptians, and their useful and decorative arts. In the Religions Division are contained the representations of the deities of the ancient Egyptian Pantheon; the figures of Sacred Animals, and the various Religious Amulets and Emblems to which sacred and symbolical meanings were assigned. Many of these last were enjoined by the Ritual of the Dead to be placed with the mummied remains of deceased persons, but are, nevertheless, more conveniently enumerated in this rather than in the next succeeding Division.
